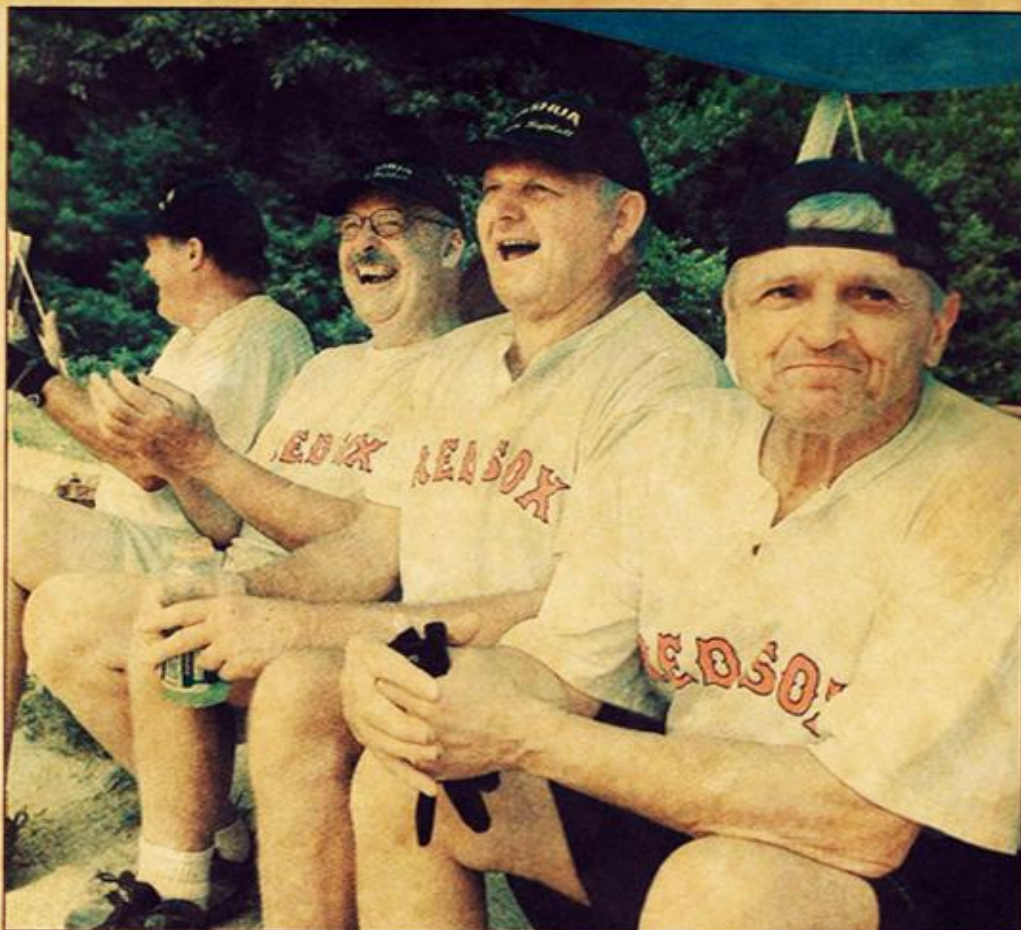

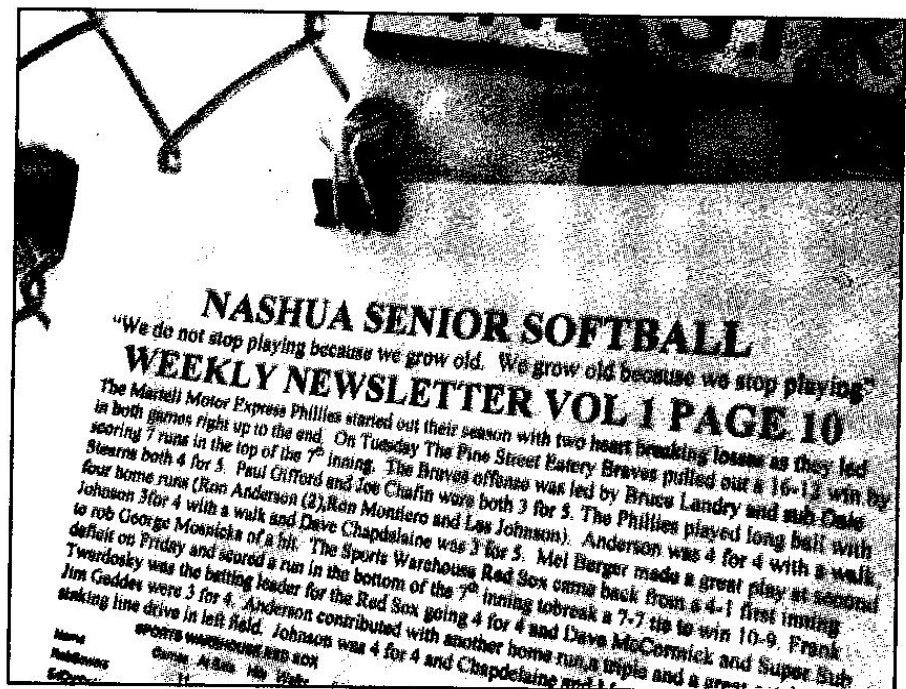
Subtract the second digit from the age of these players, and that's exactly how they feel between the white lines. To be six or seven again, if just for one day, frolicking on a baseball diamond.

William Mulley has one of his giddy moments, as players leave the field and wife Diane fires up the caravan for a little karaoke session between her husband and fellow Nashua Senior Softball League player Dave McCormack.

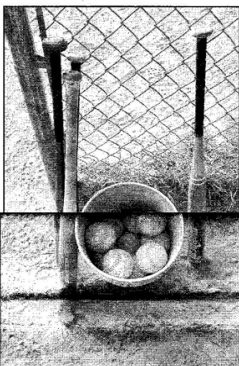
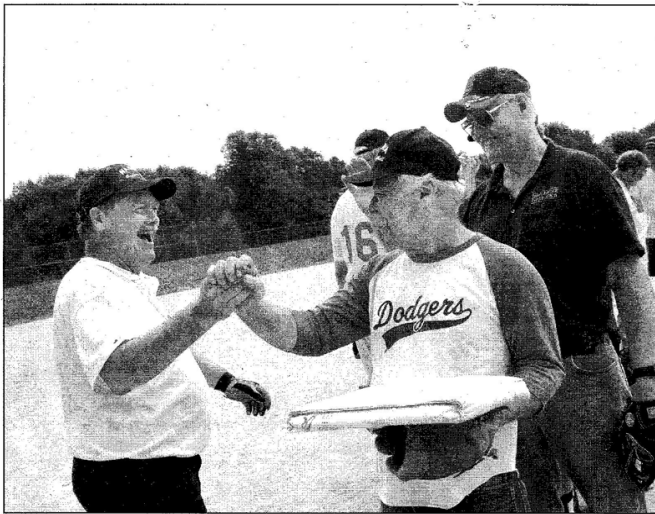

Organizer's persistence pays off

Nobody thought he could get the job done. Impossible, was a word thrown at him constantly – and that was from his own wife.

Sixty-nine-year-old William Mulley proved her and all the other doubters wrong. If he built it, he believed the senior-aged residents of Greater Nashua would come. So Mulley created the Nashua Senior Softball League for players age 60 and older, and to this point 36 have come.

"I came from Florida, where I golfed, played tennis and played softball," said Mulley, who spends eight months in Nashua and four back in Daytona Beach, Fla. "I came up here and was able to play tennis and kept golfing. But I missed softball. The closest senior league for softball players is down in Methuen (Mass.), and that's too far for me to drive for games two or three times a week. So I decided to start something up here, and for the first year, this is better than I expected."

The league he speaks of over the border is part of the Ken Waldie Senior Sports Circuit Inc., named after a Methuen man who was a passenger on the ill-fated American Airlines Flight 11 on Sept. 11, 2001. It started as a senior basketball league and slowly turned into a non-profit organization promoting softball, basketball, bocce and a healthy and active lifestyle for seniors 50 and over.

"I heard so many good things about their program," said Mulley, who along with some of the Nashua Senior Softball League members have started a small tennis group as well. "I just felt we needed something like that closer to home. Who knows, someday we may have games against them."

One person Mulley has sold on the idea is his wife Diane. From the outset she had her doubts. When the first e-mails were sent out in late January and early February, she was simply humoring her husband.

"I told him flat out you will never get enough response to field one team," Diane said. "I just told him keep trying, I don't mind if you do this as long as it doesn't take up too much of your time. All along I was still thinking there wouldn't be enough people anyway."

She was wrong.

McCormack of Hudson. "We get out on that field and the age is irrelevant. They gave us our chance to be kids again, and now we really feel like kids again."

The idea, spawned from the senior leagues Mulley was part of in Florida where divisions of 50-, 60- and 70-year-olds played, has the Nashua resident held on a pedestal by his peers of the Greater Nashua area.

They were longing for that chance to do something more than reminisce about the past. They wanted to replicate it.

Diving catches, turning two in the middle, rounding third on a bloop single in hopes of scoring the tying or go-ahead run – all memories until this summer.

"It's so much fun to actually get out and do it again," said Fred Martell, team sponsor and player for the Martell Motors Express Phillies. "I played with McCormack and Les

Johnson 50 years ago in little league down in Billerica (Mass.), and now I step on the field and it's like I'm back there all over again."

As the league's motto states: "We do not stop playing because we grow old. We grow old because we stop playing."

The 60-year-old Hollis resident may not be as fleet of foot nowadays, but that will not stop him from competing and staying young.

"It's been 28 years since I played softball or baseball," said Martell, a utility player. "This is very satisfying for me. I play a lot of golf, but there was always that higher level of competition missing from my life. This gives me that once more."

While the defensive highlights continue to roll in reel after reel, with leaping grabs, dives to the left and right and some fancy footwork around the second base bag, the offense is not lacking much either.

The ball can still fly off the bat, many dropping just short of the 300-

foot outfield fence during games. At 65, Derry's Dale Stearns is one of the more physically fit players. The Nashua area investment advisor works hard out of the office to stay in shape. The certified high school football, basketball and softball official runs five miles a day, plays racquetball and throws in a little tennis for good measure.

The shortstop and manager of the Sports Warehouse Red Sox has seen the league grow from its original 14 players on two teams – where batters could not hit the ball to right field

over the first few weeks – to a 36-member league of three teams of 12. According to Stearns there is a reason for it.

"We may not be able to do all the things we used to when we were kids," he said, "and the body doesn't function quite like it used to."

Stopping for a moment, his smile grows wider with each passing second.

"I'll tell you why I'm here, and why every one of these guys is here," Stearns insists. "We are all chomping at the bit for that competitive fire to burn again. Yeah, this is a fun league. Yeah, this is about enjoying each other's company and getting exercise and playing a game. But for most it's about trying to get back something we feel we may have lost somewhere along the way."

Martell loves the camaraderie and the outdoor activity with newfound and long-lost friends.

He believes everyone involved enjoys those aspects as well. However,

as Stearns stressed, do not let these old-timers fool you.

"It's about spirit and togetherness," Martell said, "but don't get me wrong – everybody loves to win. We don't like to make errors, or fly out, or hit into a double play."

McCormack laughs at the thought of this league only being about fun. There really is a deeper desire to travel back in time to the days of Charlie Hustle. Unfortunately for these players there's a rule against charging into home for a collision.

Not that some of the guys on the field will remember that rule when the blood gets flowing and the game begins.

"You watch a few of these games and you'll see guys really going all out," McCormack said. "It's like they had this aggression built up in them over the years and finally have a way to release it. Once that adrenaline is flowing it's tough to come down until the game is finished."

For them, the game will never end.

The newspaper clips above explain the start of the league. In March of 2007 the initial Bylaws were approved by the Board. They were written by Gerry Moore. The Board at that time was Charlie Howe, President, Dale Stearns, Vice President, Bill Barnes, Treasurer, Henry Perras, Secretary, and Ron Anderson, Director of Rules. The structure of the League wasn't set up until March 2007 when the Bylaws were approved and the League registered with the State as a Nonprofit Organization. We then started voting for Board members and Officers. Henry Perras was responsible for starting the web and registered our League with USA Senior Softball. Subsequent web masters were Dick Brown and Gerry Moore. Bo Buczynski took over in 2012 and has been our web master since then.

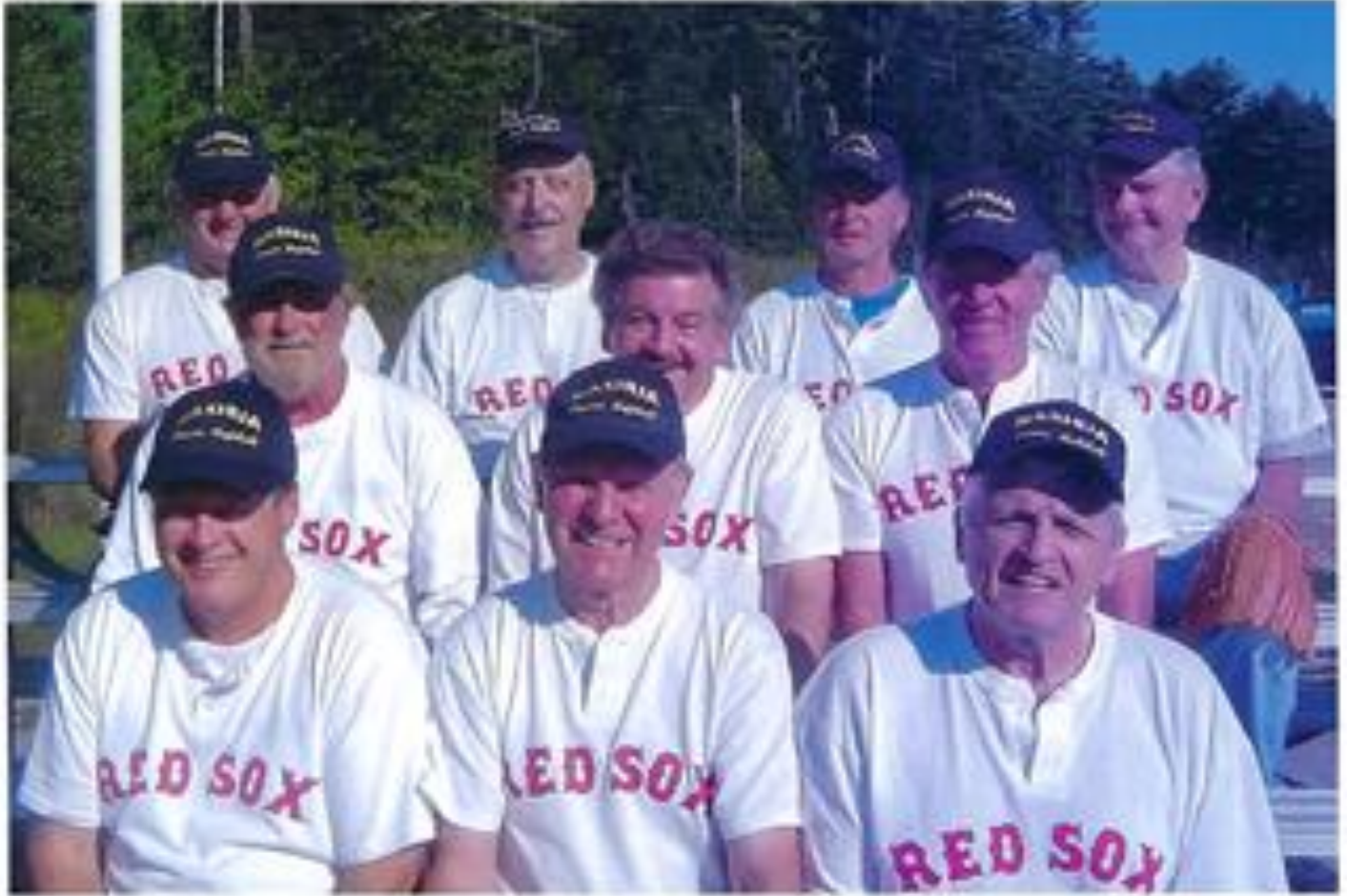

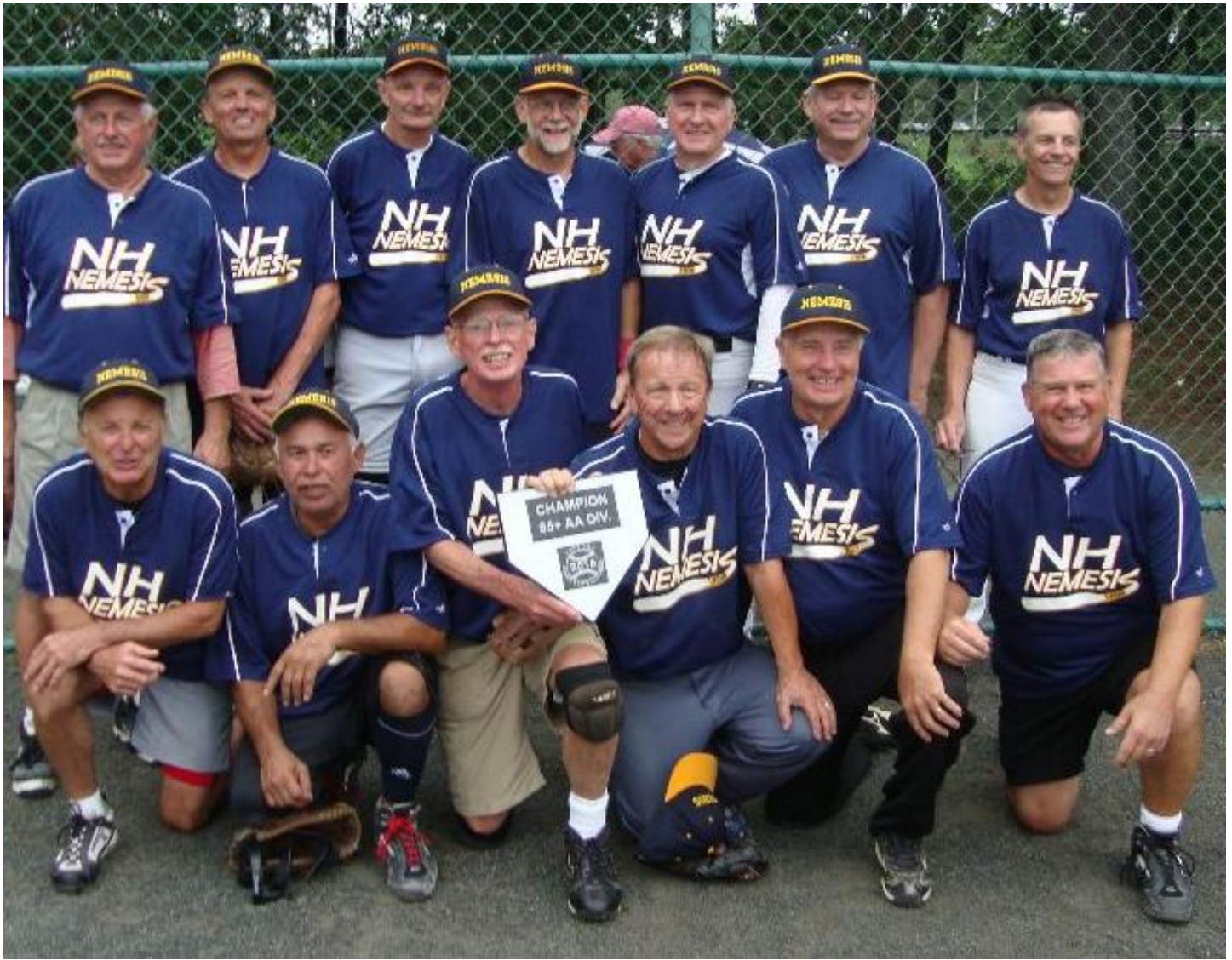

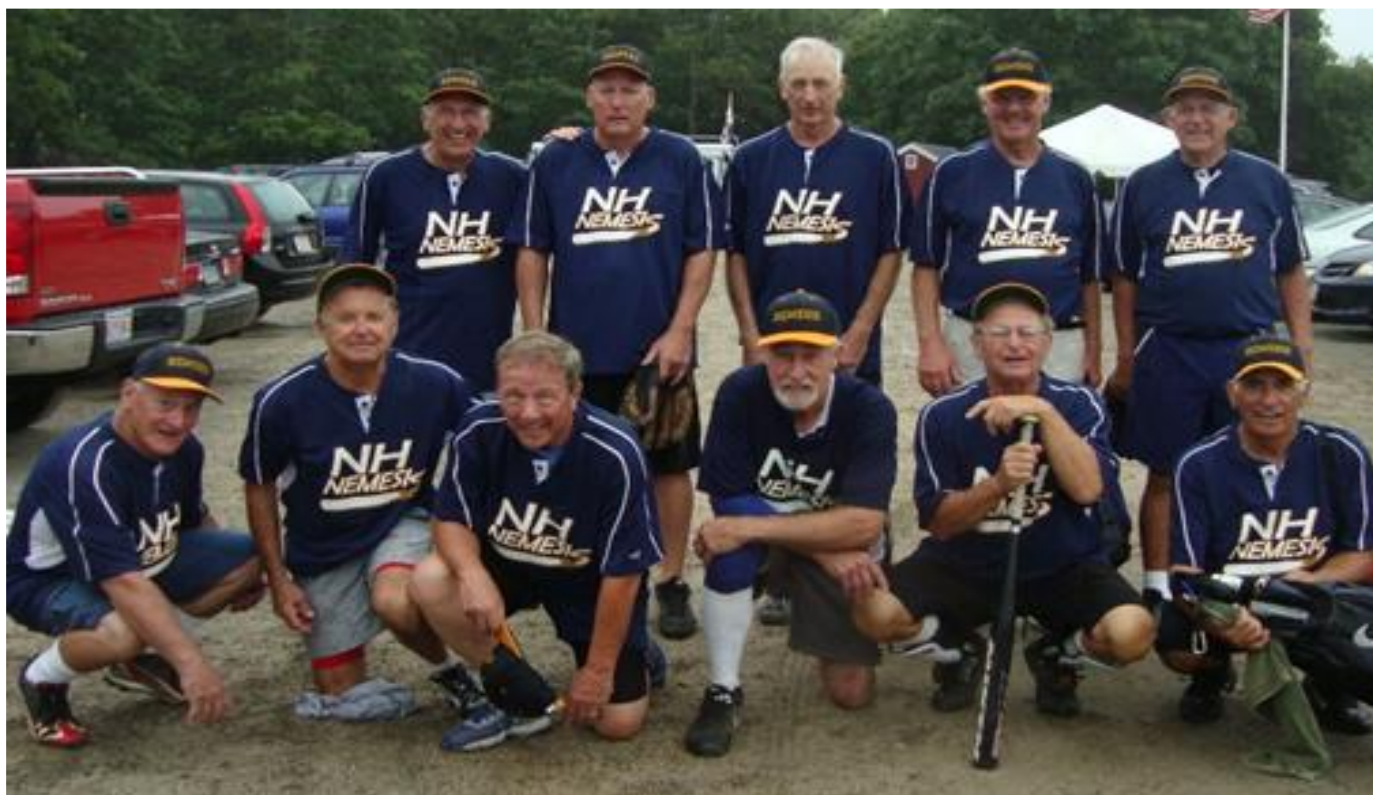
