Answer: If two runners are between the same bases when a thrown ball goes out of play, the award is based on the position of the lead runner. In this case, Lisa was the lead runner, so she gets 2nd and 3rd, and McKenna stays at 2nd.

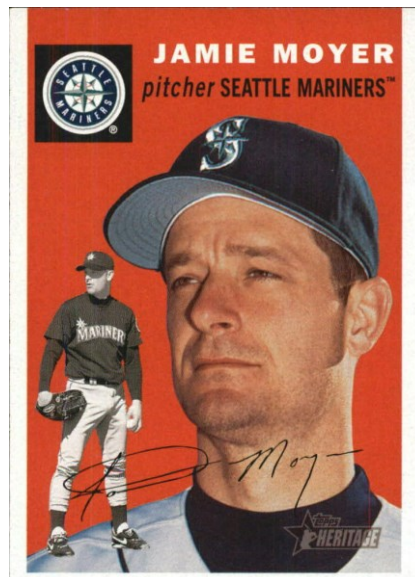
