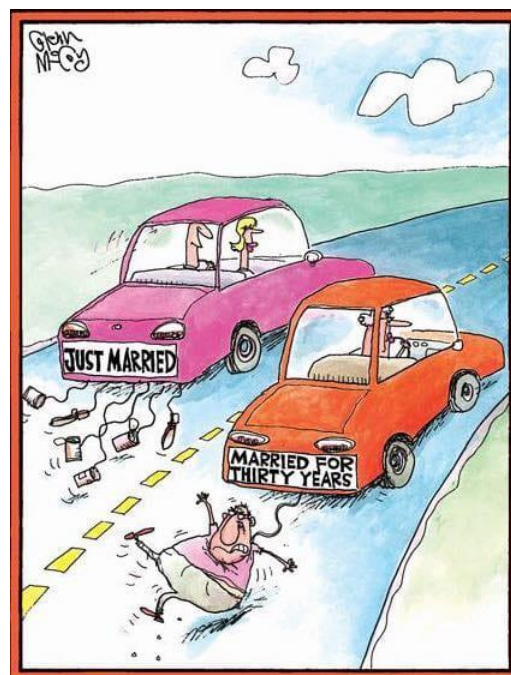
Pine Street wins a heart stopper

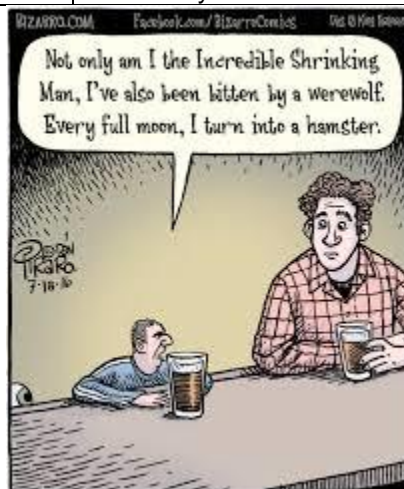
Visionworks rallies to win

What's the call, Ump?

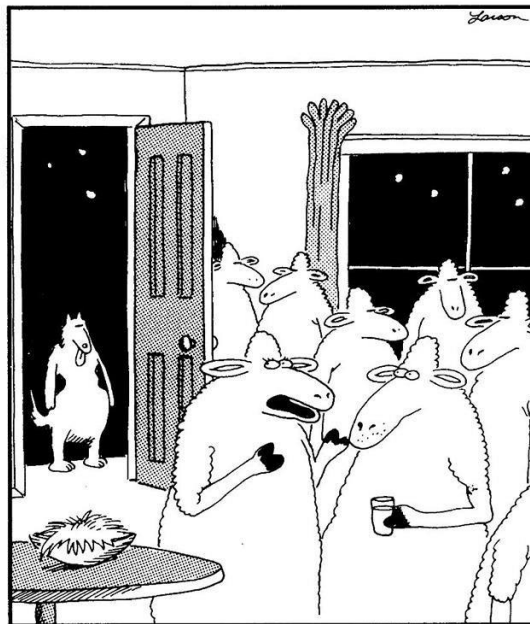
No outs, runners on 1st and 2nd. The batter hits a hooking liner that first base snags on the fly, but the ball falls out of his glove. Meanwhile the runners thinking it was a catch have returned to their bases. The first baseman throws to 2nd baseman who tags the runner standing on 2nd and tags the runner who was on 1st running to 2nd. The batter runs safely to first base. Is this a double play? Is this the correct call?

Unfortunately, for the surprised runners, it is a double play. A liner is not an infield fly because it is considered a tougher play. However, if in the umpire's judgement, the fielder has deliberately dropped the ball to trick the runners, he could rule the batter out and return the runners to their bases.

And a correction on the play where the batter tapped a ball that had landed short and rolled onto home plate. It seems we got it wrong.

Rule Book §7.5 • BALL CALLED BY UMPIRE (Page 42)

A. For each legally pitched ball that does not hit the strike mat, or touches the ground before reaching the strike mat, and the batter does not swing. Any pitched ball that hits the ground or strike mat cannot be legally swung at by the batter. NOTE: If the batter swings at a pitch after the ball hits the ground, the ball is dead, and all runners return to the base occupied at the time of the pitch. A ball is called.
